ESTABLISHED: 8/8/2000
COMPENSATION: None, but may receive actual and necessary expenses as are incurred.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Board of Supervisors Resolution # 98-950 (Urgency Ordinance C.S.687) and #2000-637.
Revised 2/12/2002, Resolution 2002-95.

MEMBERSHIP: The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members, **appointed** by the Board of Supervisors:
QUALIFICATION: One member of the Board of Supervisors
AND RESIDENCY: One County Health Officer
REQUIREMENTS: Two of the following County Department Heads:
*Health Services Agency
*Behavioral Health & Recovery Services
*Community Services Agency
One representative of a local school district
Four members who represent the following categories:
*Recipients of Project Services included in the Strategic Plan
*Educators specializing in Early Childhood Development
*A local Child Care Resource or Referral agency or a local child care coordinating group
*A local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk
*Community-based organizations that have the goal of promoting nurturing and early childhood development
*Local school districts
*Local medical, pediatric or obstetric associations or societies

TERM: Terms shall be for three years.

DUTIES: To implement the goals and objectives of the Act. To administer the monies in the Stanislaus County Children and Families First Trust Fund. Adoption of a County Strategic Plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within the County as outlined in the Act. To conduct at least one public hearing on its proposed Strategic Plan before the plan is adopted and before any revisions to the plan are adopted. To submit the adopted plan and any revisions to the State Commission and the Board of Supervisors. To prepare and adopt an annual audit and report pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 130150. To conduct at least one public hearing prior to adopting any annual audit and report. To conduct at least one public hearing on each annual report by the state commission prepared pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 130150, subdivision (b). To make copies of annual audits and reports available to members of the general public on request and at no cost. To exercise all powers, duties and functions as are prescribed by statute, the Board of Supervisors, and the Commission.
